## **General Comments and Recommendations**

#### Comments

Program Advisor (PA) Diego Beltran conducted an unannounced licensing inspection.

During the site inspection, program advisor reviewed the CCLS profile data, specifically the centre civic address, Licensee/child care centre's contact information, program duration and hours of operation with supervisor to confirm information is up to date and accurate.

Licensee stated there has some been changes to their policies and procedures. As a result the following policies have been assessed for compliance: Policies and Procedures for monitoring compliance and contraventions, supervision of students and volunteers, playground safety policy, medication administration policy, serious occurrence policy, safe arrival and dismissal policy.

Licensee and PA discussed individual support plans for the children with special needs. The licensee stated they will be increasing their enrolment in the fall and discussed some of the challenges that this change can bring. The licensee stated their goal to remain inclusive of all needs while maintaining quality childcare and meeting the needs of all children. PA and licensee discussed possible staggered start dates to allow for a smooth transition into higher enrolment.

Program statement: Educators are responsive to the children's emotional needs, educators were observed singing songs during transitions as a way to comfort some children that were emotional. During the afternoon program, the children engaged in a variety of table activities which included open ended crafts. The staff placed themselves appropriately throughout the room to ensure proper support and supervision of the group.

#### Recommendations

Recommend enhancing the wording on the "description/location of people or aids used to support" section on the individual emergency medical plan of a child, to clearly identify individuals involved as support.

Recommend consulting with CSA certified inspector on any playground inspections that may be required in the future. Recommend this communication is documented.
