We have been having lots of fun with the children as they are mastering new skills.

April's weather can still be chilly outside so please send your child in oversized splash pants so they will be warm and dry when playing outdoors. IN THE CLASSROOM RESOURCES

Our program is based on the interest of the children, therefore it is difficult to plan in advance what each class will be exploring. Some ideas may include: If the children are interested in planting and gardening we might read Jack and the Beanstalk and begin planting. If bunnies and spring thoughts are in the air, activities may include songs like Elephants have wrinkles, I am a little teapot, skinamarinku dinku dink and the Jellufish song. We have a variety of great books to explore and often the children enjoy the book about Little Rabbit Foo Foo, which may cause us to ao on a scavenger hunt. Children will continue to be introduced to fine motor development as teachers offer opportunities to use pencils, various mediums and scissors. We noticed on our Special Me posters that many families have pets at home, which might prompt talk about our pets at home. Our KP class have been having fun with telling jokes and show & share!
