CLASSROOM DEVELOPMENTS & PROVOCATIONS

Staff will continue to support children with their unique goals and objectives to help foster their development and skills.

Cutting and pencil grip, fine motor, and name recognition will continue to be supported when the children find interest in them. We will encourage full body development from gross motor to fine motor, social emotional and cognitive skills.

Friendship skills will continue to be fostered as new relationships are blossoming! Staff scaffold and role model positive interactions and aid children in entrance to play skills.

Over the next couple months, we will be noticing random acts of kindness. We will try to catch the children in the act of offering a nice word, a helping hand, or compliment. We will acknowledge and encourage everyone to 'Explore the Good' and 'Make Kindness the Norm'. Tune into kindness, spread kindness in the simplest ways, and be a bucket filler!

The children continue to find interest in building using popsicle sticks, sugar cubes and glue, and study buildings in our immediate area as well as pictures from around the world. It will be interesting to see how the children plan, create, reflect and recreate their structures and the process they go through to get to their end product. Here's a fun video called Let's Build a House. We will further explore our senses (sight, hearing, taste, smell, feel) and keep talking about our emotions and feelings. We will embrace Spring and the animals and birds that we often find at this time of year such as bunnies and egg activities!

SONGS & GAMES

The children love to use rhythm sticks to learn new songs like 'This Old Man'. We will sing 'Mr. Knickerbocker' and 'Jellyfish'

Songs the children have showed interest in learning are 'Freeze Dance' and 'What's Missing' games. Please watch for other updates and fun things that will pop up that we find interest the children. Some outdoor games include 'Going on a Bear Hunt', 'Duck, Duck, Goose', and 'What Time is it Mister Wolf'.


BOOKS

REGISTER FOR FALL 2023

Early enrollment for the 2023-2024 schoolyear begins March 21 for current WCP members. Get the spot and committee you want by registering early! Pre-registration forms and your \$23.63 membership fee will be required to reserve your child's spot. A full registration package will be sent in April to all families who complete the pre-registration process.

Fall registration for new members will begin the week of April 6th.

COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT LAB

The University of Waterloo often conducts a Coanitive Development Lab with our families for those of age for the research they are conducting and for those interested in participating. Watch for information as the month goes on. This study helps university Psychology students research how children do things. Last year it was how they communicate. They looked at children aged 4-5 and what their ability is to produce and comprehend messages effectively. They also looked at how children use non verbal cues from others to guide their communication.

FINAL NOTES

Parent Engagement and Responsive Relationships are a main focus this year for the Staff. A second main focus is using the environment as our 3rd teacher. Staff are embracing nature and engaging nature as much as we can. We are focusing for the rest of this year on using the environment as the 3rd teacher, meaning providing intentional activities for the children to explore and gain a love for learning in a natural environment. You will hopefully see more and more nature in our daily world!

Parents please be sure to always add your child's full name and class they are in when communicating with the preschool staff or board members. All payments must include child's name

Please be mindful of any symptoms of illness and help keep our classes healthy by not attending when ill. If your child is sick with any symptoms of illness or have any cold or flu symptoms they need to stay at home until they are fever free for 24 hours and vomiting, diarrhea free for 48 hours. If your child is going to be absent please remember to fill out our Reason for absence form.

JK REGISTRATION

For all children born in 2019, it's time to register for Junior Kindergarten! Please note that school attendance is not mandatory until Grade One. JK and SK years in the school system are a 2 year program that is very similar to the Waterloo Cooperative Preschool KP program that we offer Tuesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons. Families can choose to attend JK in September in their local school, OR they can continue with us in our KP program until January or for the full JK year as an option. Some families choose to combine KP and JK in their local school, attending JK every morning and WCP every afternoon. There are many options we can explore together, and with our Resource Consultant from KW Habilitation, Please do not hesitate to reach out.
