This newsletter is intended to help prepare you for the start of the school year. We hope you have had a happy, fun-filled, safe summer holiday. We are readily available by email should you have any questions that pop up! The **week of September 11**, the Toddler and Preschool children will only attend one day, in a small group, so the educators can get to know each child. KP will start off in their regular classes.

Please be sure the educators are informed and prepared to accommodate your child's individual needs by communicating as much information as necessary to ensure safety and a smooth transition for everyone.

We will post allergies and any Individual Support Plans that we create in order to ensure all staff and those interacting with your child are well aware of any limitations, areas requiring support or food & environmental allergens we need to avoid.

WHAT TO PACK

We plan to spend as much time outdoors as possible throughout the ENTIRE year, so please dress your child for the weather.

It's also a good idea to send your child with a sun hat or baseball cap, and apply sunscreen or bug spray if desired, at home.

Please do not send any creams, lip balms, bug spray or other items that can be applied before or after our short program. We are not able to apply any creams or lip balms.

Please be sure your child uses the washroom and washes their hands before coming each day so they can maximize their time outside.

We ask that *Toddlers* and *Preschoolers* pack their items in a large Ziploc bag. Please include a change of clothing, diapers or pull ups, wipes and indoor shoes and label the bag with your child's name. This bag as well as the indoor shoes will remain at the preschool. Toddlers and Preschoolers are also to bring a clean, empty water bottle to school with their name clearly written on it.

. The bottle will be sent home with them after each class.

We are preparing our *KinderPrep* students for school! With this being said, we ask that they bring a backpack with them to school each day. Please include a closed, labeled, reusable water bottle and a clean but empty Tupperware type of container that has a lid., also labeled. We will serve the students their snack in the containers each day so they can practice opening and closing their container and returning it to their backpack. The cleaned water bottle and container should return in their backpack each day. Please do not store food or medications in your child's backpack without ensuring that the staff is well aware of the contents.


CLOTHING LABELS

All personal items including bags, backpacks, hats, sweaters, shoes, jackets and water bottles need to be clearly labelled with your child's name.

You can order peel-and-stick or iron-on labels from **Lovable Labels** and we will receive a small fundraising credit for any orders. The funds collected from the last school year was put back into new books for the classroom.

MORE ON STAGGERED STARTS

The week following our *Preview Day*, our staggered start week begins! During *the week of September 11*, your child will only attend once (for Toddler and Preschool classes only), and in a small group so the educators can get to know each child!

Please be sure the educators are informed and prepared to accommodate your child's individual needs by communicating as much information as necessary to ensure safety and a great time for everyone! The children's Developmental Domains form is a great tool that we use to get a good snapshot of your child and it is included in your registration package. Please fill it out and ensure the educators get it. Any emergency plans and, ISPs will be done before the children can be left without a parent. Parents who feel they must remain onsite on their child's first day can plan to stay in the parking lot and the educators will be in touch if we need to contact you.

Our Toddler class will be broken down to a 45-minute staggered start in order to have intimate time to get to know each other. You will be assigned a time slot on either *Tuesday, September 12* or *Thursday, September 14*. Starting the following week, the Toddler class will run from 9:15-10:30 until they have settled in enough to manage a full class. The educators will maintain open communication during this time. Full class time (9-11am) and outside time will begin after Thanksgiving.

For our Preschool classes, children will be assigned one day to attend class for the full time during the week of September 11th. Regular classes will begin the week after (Sept 18-22). If you feel a shorter visit would be better for your child in the beginning please just mention it to the educators, as this often is a great strategy to ensure an easy, comfortable transition. Some families drop off later and pick up early. Please discuss what is best for your family with educators Tracey and Patty.

Note: KinderPrep classes will start as <u>the full duration</u> the week of *September 11th.*

Throughout the year, staff will work hard to support children with their unique goals and objectives to help child development, social skills and other skills. Cutting, pencil grip, and name recognition will be a focus in our Preschool and KinderPrep classes. We will encourage full body development from gross motor to fine motor, and work on social, emotional, friendship and cognitive skills with all.

We post allergies and any Individual Support Plans and Emergency Plans that we create to ensure all staff and those interacting with your child are well aware of any limitations, areas needing support, or foods/environmental allergens we need to avoid.

SNACK TIME

We provide water on demand at all times and provide a healthy snack half way through the class. Snacks this year will include things like Graham crackers, rice cakes, tortillas, Cheerios, bananas, Triscuits, vegetables such as cucumber. carrots, peppers, mini tomatoes and fruit like apples, oranges, grapes, berries. You can find the menu listed in the Parent Handbook or on SeeSaw. If your child has any allergies or sensitivities please be sure the Educators have this listed on their registration form and any Emergency plans and medications are provided in advance of them starting. Please do not send snacks or juice or milk with your child unless there is a dietary requirement listed and discussed with the Supervisor. We have several allergies in our program and do everything we can to prevent exposure to allergens.

STAY IN TOUCH

Your satisfaction is important to us. We hope this will be a great experience for your family. Help us to maintain open communication and celebrate your wonderful child!

You will be able to reach out to the educators by email, through Zoom meetings, and in the <u>Seesaw app</u> (watch for your invite soon).

Please be sure to visit the app often to view pictures of your child's interactions, explorations, growth, and development throughout the year.

COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENT

All families are assigned either a Board role or a co-op role. Co-op roles are described in the parent handbook and are essential to the operation of the preschool. Examples are cleaning, fundraising, snack, shopper, member assistant, admin. If you are unable to participate in a coop role you may be able to pay a optout fee, although few opt-out spots are available.

SCREEN TIME

Our partners at **KidsAbility** and KW Habilitation would like us to remind parents that screen time for children should be reduced if not eliminated if possible. Consider fostering your child's communication skills with conversation over screen time, especially during a meal! Reciprocal conversations with back and forth contributions to meaningful conversations are known to enhance child development. You can see more information on screen time tips here.

AS THE YEAR BEGINS...

Please be sure to keep up-to-date information on file with the school for any new addresses, cell numbers, or personal needs or allergies. No medications can be dispensed unless an emergency plan is in place for the use of an epi pen or asthma inhaler.

Waterloo Co-operative Preschool takes every precaution necessary to ensure the safety of our membership. We continue to have strong healthcare practices and ensure that only healthy individuals enter the facility every day. If your child is going to be absent, please notify the educators each day of absence and indicate if illness is a factor. If they are not coming due to a symptom of illness please inform the educators as well by completing the absence form found here.

Parents wishing to withdraw their child from Waterloo Co-operative Preschool must give one calendar month's notice and agree to pay for one full calendar month following the submission of the withdrawal form, found <u>here</u>. Please note that no partial month's fees will be reimbursed for withdrawing before the end of the month.





PARENT RESOURCES

Waterloo Co-operative Preschool partners with Kidsability and KW Habilitation. Special needs resources are available for any child in licensed care that needs it. We have a Resource Consultant who is happy to help us accommodate needs that arise for the educators and children.

Please remember that It is suggested that children have their hearing and sight tested by age 4 before going to school, and anytime if they are having troubles looking at books, are coming too close to things, or are tripping.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS
